

NEBRASKA ARMY NATIONAL GUARD AIRCRAFT MAKES EMERGENCY LANDING

LINCOLN, Neb. – Pilots flying a CH-47 Chinook helicopter made an emergency precautionary landing at the Nebraska Army National Guard's Greenlief Training Site near Hastings at approximately 6:30 p.m. Wednesday evening.

All four crew members were evaluated by medical personnel, and no injuries have been reported. No emergency response services from outside the training site were needed.

An investigation is being conducted to determine the cause of the incident. The aircraft sustained damage and will remain in place until the investigation has been conducted.

The helicopter and crew are based at the Nebraska Army National Guard's aviation support facility in Grand Island.
