TRADITIONAL VACANCY ANNOUNCEMENT

Position Title & Unit: Plans SGT, HHD, 110th MMB, TXKAA, 107/05

Location: Lincoln, NE

Military Grade Range: Minimum E6/SSG- Maximum E7/SFC

Military Requirements: Designated CPMOS for this position 68W40 minimum score of 105 in aptitude area ST and 110 in aptitude are GT in ASVAB tests administered prior to 2 January 2002; a minimum score of 102 in ST and 110 in GT on ASVAB administered on or after 2 January 2002 and prior to 1 July; minimum score 101 in ST and 107 in GT on ASVAB administered on or after 1 July 2004. Must meet the physical demands requirements of DA Pam 611-21. MOS qualification, if required, must be completed IAW current policy and training guidance. Selected individual may incur additional training requirements for SQI and/or ASI requirements for the duty position (see unit specific requirements below). The qualifications for the award of this MOS can be found in DA Pam 611-21.

Area of Consideration: All eligible members of the Nebraska Army National Guard and individuals who are eligible for Enlistment or transfer into the Nebraska Army National Guard who meet the grade requirements stated in Military Grade Range listed above. In order to be promoted in this position, the Soldier must be on the current STEP list and fully qualified for promotion IAW AR 600-8-19. Soldiers not holding the requisite NCOES for their current grade must agree to complete all NCOES/SSD Requirements within one year of assignment.

General Requirements:

1. Currently assigned in the Nebraska Army National Guard with a rank in the range listed in Military Grade Range.
2. Not currently "Flagged from Favorable Personnel Actions" or under a "Bar to Reenlistment"
3. Meet other requirements as stated in **Military Requirements** above.

Summary of Duties: Supervises para-professional medical service activities in large fixed and mobile treatment facilities. Serves as medical platoon sergeant/detachment NCO or clinic NCOIC. The organization's senior medic and medical training NCO. Responsible for all unit combat medics, medical equipment/supplies, and coordination of key resources. Mentor of the junior medical officer/platoon leader.

Other Unit Unique Considerations/Requirements: Must maintain a current, valid, unrestricted National Registry Emergency Medical Technician (NREMT) Certification to retain MOS 68W. (SFC(P)s and MSGs are exempt from this requirement). No history of felony conviction. No history of conviction of crimes involving: (a) An out of hospital patient or a patient or resident of a medical care facility. (b) Financial exploitation of a person entrusted to the care of the applicant. (c) Any weapons/ammunition/explosives/arson charges. (d) Any drug activity involving illegal possession, buying, selling, or distribution (dealing) of controlled substances or synthetics. (e) Violence against persons, animals or property. (f) Sexual misconduct. Must have no history of alcoholism, drug addiction, indiscriminate use of habit-forming or dangerous drugs.
