The Adjutant General, Nebraska National Guard



Major General Daryl L. Bohac serves as the Adjutant General for the State of Nebraska, Lincoln, Nebraska. As the Adjutant General, he is the senior uniformed National Guard officer responsible for formulating, developing, and coordinating policies, programs and plans affecting more than 4,800 Army and Air National Guard personnel. Appointed by the Governor, General Bohac serves as a principal on the Governor's Staff and is the Director of the Nebraska Military Department and the Nebraska Emergency Management Agency, respectively. As the Adjutant General, he commands the Nebraska Army and Air National Guard and serves as the state's official channel of communication with the National Guard Bureau to the Departments of the Army and Air Force. Prior to his current assignment, General

Bohac served as the Assistant Adjutant General of the Nebraska Air National Guard and the Deputy Adjutant General of the Nebraska Military Department.

General Bohac was commissioned in 1988 at the Air National Guard Academy of Military Science, McGhee-Tyson Air National Guard Base, Tennessee. Prior to receiving his commission, General Bohac served as an enlisted member of the United States Marine Corps Reserve and of the Nebraska Air National Guard. General Bohac deployed in support of Operation Enduring Freedom as the Senior Air Reserve Component Advisor for Air Force Central Command, Al Udeid Air Base, Qatar from December 2008 to May 2009. He has also deployed in support of Operations Noble Eagle, Decisive Endeavor and Deliberate Guard.
