SUBJECT: Adherence to Protective Health Measures

2. The National Guard has a responsibility to our communities, State, and Nation to serve and protect. Preserving the health of the force is imperative to this mission and requires every employee to do their part by complying with protective health measures to include:

- a. Social Distancing – Maintain a minimum of six feet of separation if at all possible.
- b. Wear of cloth facial coverings or masks when it is not possible to maintain six feet separation.
- c. Frequently wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds especially after you have been in a public place, or after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.
- d. Respond honestly to screening questions and follow instructions of screeners.
- e. Stay home from work if ill or symptomatic and immediately notify Supervisor.
- f. Report any potential COVID-19 exposures to the Medical Case Manager


