**Military Requirements:** Designated DMOS for this position is 68W3F. 68WF2 Flight Paramedic NCO must possess the following qualifications: Waivers, and/or exceptions must be approved by Cdr, USAACE, ATTN: ATZQ-CDF-P, Ft Novosel, AL 36362-5000, ([http://www.novosel.army.mil/usaace/directorates/cdid/opfd/iw\\_enlisted.html](http://www.novosel.army.mil/usaace/directorates/cdid/opfd/iw_enlisted.html)).

Must have Additional Skill Identifier (ASI) **Code:** F **Title:** Flying Status a. Identifies positions that require Soldiers to perform frequent and repetitive aerial flight(s), including MOS 68W positions.

b. *Qualifications.* Must volunteer for flight duty and complete qualifying physical examination for flight status as prescribed in AR 40-501.

c. *Restrictions.* Designated positions will not exceed flight authorizations per AR 600-106.

(a) A physical demands rating of Significant (Gray). (b) A physical profile of 111121. (c) No aversion to blood. (d) Must possess finger dexterity in both hands. (6) Qualifying scores. (a) A minimum score of 101 in aptitude area ST, effective 9 October 2023. (b) A minimum OPAT score of Standing Long Jump (LJ) – 0140 cm, Seated Power Throw (PT) – 0400 cm, Strength Deadlift (SD) – 0140 lbs., and Interval Aerobic Run (IR) – 0040 shuttles in Physical Demand Category in “Significant” (Gray). (e) 10, chapter 24. Formal training (completion of MOS 68W course conducted under auspices of U.S Army Medical Center of Excellence) mandatory; or completion of the Exportable 68W10 Course conducted by reserve component (RC) unit approved by the MEDCoE; All prior MOS 68W Soldiers serving in another MOS reclassifying back into MOS 68W, will be reviewed for validation of skills, by the proponent, during the reclassification process.

**Area of Consideration:** All eligible and available members of the Nebraska Army National Guard or eligible personnel available for transfer into the Nebraska Army National Guard serving in the grade range listed above. To be promoted in this position, the Soldier must be fully qualified for promotion IAW AR 600-8-19.

**General Requirements:**

1. Currently assigned E5/SGT- E6/SSG of the Nebraska Army National Guard or any personnel eligible for transfer into the Nebraska Army National Guard.
2. Not currently "Flagged from Favorable Personnel Actions", under a "Bar to Reenlistment", or defined as "Stagnant".
3. Meet other requirements as stated in **Military Requirements** above.
4. Must become RL1/NVG/Day/Night qualified, must hold the “F” ASI.

**Summary of Duties:** MOS 68W Flight Paramedic Specialist

a. *Major Duties.* The flight medic specialist provides emergency medical treatment, limited primary care, force health protection, evacuation in a variety of operational and clinical settings from the point of injury or illness through the continuum of military health care and, as a field combat medic,

provides emergency medical care/treatment at the point of wounding on the battlefield or to battle and non-battle casualties during wartime.

**Other Unit Unique Considerations/Requirements: MOS 68WF20.** Administers emergency and routine medical treatment to battle and non-battle casualties assists with outpatient care and treatment and supervises field, arial, and clinical medical facilities under the supervision of a physician, nurse, or physician's assistant. Serves as a team leader/supervisor to subordinate combat medical specialists and lead instructor of company Combat Lifesaver/First Responder medical training. Conducts company-level medical planning. Supervises unit personnel medical readiness, requests medical supplies, and performs triage NCO duties.

**MOS 68WF30.**

Supervises activities of field, arial, clinical, and mobile treatment facilities. Serves as squad leader/section supervisor. Optimizes the use of Class VIII medical supplies and resources. Develops medical standard operating procedures (SOPs). Performs medical interventions with a higher technical ability. Principal trainer of squad/section personnel.
