SPECIALTY SUMMARY

Commands 72nd CERFP Medical Element, whose primary mission is to respond to Homeland Security (HLS) and Homeland Defense (HLD) contingencies in order to provide medical support to civil authorities in Nebraska, FEMA Region VII, or CONUS / OCONUS to save lives and mitigate suffering.

QUALIFICATIONS AND SELECTION FACTORS:

- Selection for this position will be made without regard to race, religion, color, creed, gender, or national origin.
- Applicants may be subject to review by the Force Support Squadron to ensure mandatory requirements are met as outlined in applicable regulations.
- Applicants must meet an Interview Board.
- Applicants must live within 6 hours of, Lincoln, NE (155 MDG Det 1)

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

- Must possess a fully qualified Medical 4XXX AFSC per Air Force Officer Classification Directory.
- Applicants must be minimum grade of O-5 (O-5 promotable).
- Must be fully medically qualified.
- Applicant must have a current fitness test and be within Air Force fitness standards as outlined in DAFMAN 36-2905 at time of interview.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Commands NE CERFP Medical Element, including medical resources, operational tasks, and unit activations.
- Responsible for training, organizing, and equipping unit members.
- Determines health care requirements by analyzing mission and interpreting directives, orders, and instructions.
- Formulates plans, establishes policies and procedures for delivering health care services to CERFP Commander during joint operations.
- Implements programs such as total force training, respiratory protection and disaster preparedness.
- Ensures medical support to meet requirements placed on CERFP medical units when personnel are under operational control of the CERFP Commander.
- Directs studies and surveys to determine perceptions of personnel. Implements measures to resolve problems and eliminate conditions contributing to low morale.
- Supervises and directs assigned resources to provide quality health care services.
- Reports directly to the 155th Medical Group Commander. Advises Medical Group Commander on scope of available CERFP medical assets, health of personnel, and health protection requirements and measures.
- Conducts staff meetings, convenes, and appoints boards, councils, and committees to assist in managing assigned activities.
- Coordinates training, support, and use of medical units and activities.
- Coordinates with local health care agencies. Participates in civilian community health planning process.

KNOWLEDGE:

- Knowledge of management concepts and objectives and their relationship to mission accomplishment; relationship of military and health care doctrine, contingency, and medical readiness planning; information management; Air Force policy directives and instructions; military justice; conflict resolution; managing quality; communication and interpersonal skills; principles of medical administration; financial management; personnel; and materiel and facilities management.

EDUCATION:

- For entry into this specialty, it is mandatory to possess a degree compatible with current assignment in a medical AFSC (4XXX).

EXPERIENCE:

- Experience in a leadership position in the Air National Guard Medical Service is required and experience in the CBRN Response Enterprise is preferred.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES:

- Interested members will submit a cover letter (requesting consideration and identifying position applying for), resume(including Mil/Civ experience), 3 references, previous 3 OPBs, copy of current fitness test results, and current RIP.
- The 155th Medical Group Commander and Medical Plans Officer will confirm the qualifications of all applicants. Applicant's records will be reviewed for eligibility to determine if the applicant's total profile supports boarding the member.
