ACTIVE GUARD RESERVE VACANCY ANNOUNCEMENT

Position Title: CBRN NCO

Location: 72nd CST, Lincoln, NE

Military Grade Range: Minimum SGT/E5(P) - Maximum SSG/E6

Military Requirements: Designated MOS for this position is 74D3R. Must become MOS qualified within 12 months of assignment. Must be able to obtain and maintain a SECRET security clearance. WMD-CST personnel will sign an agreement for a 36 month stabilization tour. The stabilization of 36 months commences upon graduation from Civil Support Skills Training (CSSC). **Applicants will review the qualifications for the award of this MOS in Department of the Army Pamphlet (DA PAM) 611-21 for further demand rating and qualifications for initial award of MOS. Failure to review these qualifications may result in the applicant not being eligible for the position.**

Area of Consideration: All members of the Nebraska Army National Guard in the rank of SGT/E5(P) and above may submit applications for this position. **AGR's within 24 months of initial tour or 18 months of assignment or reassignment of closing date of this announcement requires a stabilization waiver. Stabilization waiver request must be submitted with application by closing date.**

Qualified applicants will be referred to the selecting official in the following order.

Area 1: Lateral Transfers of on-board AGR personnel (SSG/E6) eligible for MOS 74D.

Area 2: Select Train Educate Promote List (STEP) of on-board AGR CPMOS qualified (SGT/E5, 74D) if applicable.

Area 3: Transfer of on-board AGR personnel (SGT/E5(P)) if applicable.

Area 4: All current members of the Nebraska Army National Guard currently holding the rank of SGT/E5(P) and above. This position is SSG/E6 and a reduction will be required for any selected applicants above the rank/grade SSG/E6 prior to AGR start date.

General Requirements:

1. Knowledge of the organization and structure of the Air and Army National Guard.
2. Selectee will be required to pass an OSHA physical exam.
3. Selectee will be required to complete Anthrax and Smallpox immunizations.
4. Normal color vision is required.
5. Must complete the CSSC and meet all job qualifications and requirements within 1 year.
6. Must reside within 60 miles of the duty location; Lincoln, NE.

Summary of Duties: Responsible for directing the Survey Team entry and exit of a CBRNE site. Participates in the state of the art detection and sample collection technology training per the Survey Team training schedule. Expected to be proficient in CBRN antidote administration, safe patient extraction, and crime scene/evidence preservation techniques. Conducts mission back briefs with downrange team prior to entering incident sites to include the review of all information from the hazard zone, safety precautions necessary, types of tests to be conducted, and mission abort criteria. Participates in/monitors WMD CST chain of custody (sample transfer) procedures.

Follows the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) Guide when responding to incidents utilizing the appropriate respiratory protection. Utilizes the established checklist and code words in reporting the detection, identification and sample collection actions in the Hot Zone/contaminated area. Operates under the supervision of the Survey Team Leader and CBRN NCOIC. Responsible and accountable for 2 E5's, both ARNG and ANG. Total technical training requirements for this position are 739 hours which must be completed within two years of assignment in addition to applicable MOS and NCOES schools.

DA PAM 611-21

10-74 D. MOS 74D--Chemical, Biological, Radiological and Nuclear (CBRN) Specialist, CMF 74

a. *Major duties.* The CBRN specialist conduct CBRN reconnaissance and surveillance; perform decontamination operations; conduct CBRN sensitive site assessment and exploitation; and operate and perform operator maintenance on assigned CBRN defense and individual CBRN protective equipment. Additionally, in non-chemical units, CBRN NCOs/specialist plan, conduct and evaluate individual and collective CBRN training, and provide technical advice on all CBRN operations and hazards for company and higher-level organizations. Duties for MOS 74D at each level of skill are:

(1) *MOSC 74D10.* Perform as a team member in support of CBRN reconnaissance, surveillance, detection, and decontamination operations; serve as company CBRN specialist.

(2) *MOSC 74D20.* Supervise CBRN reconnaissance and surveillance, detection, and decontamination operations; serve as company CBRN NCO.

(3) *MOSC 74D30.* Lead CBRN reconnaissance/decontamination squads, and biological detection teams; serve as battalion CBRN NCO who supervise and train company level CBRN NCOs/specialists and inspect company level CBRN readiness.

(4) *MOSC 74D40.* Supervise CBRN reconnaissance and surveillance, detection, and decontamination platoons; manage operations of a chemical company; serve as the CBRN staff advisor at battalion level and higher who supervise and train subordinate level CBRN NCOs/specialists and inspect subordinate unit CBRN readiness.

(5) *MOSC 74D50.* Serve as first sergeant, MSGs, and SGMs; provide staff supervision; coordinate, supervise and conduct group, division, Corps and Army Service Component Command level CBRN operations.

b. *Physical demands rating and qualifications for initial award of MOS.* CBRN specialists must possess the following qualifications:

(1) A physical demands rating of Moderate (Gold)

(2) A physical profile of 122221.

(3) Normal color vision.

(4) Qualifying scores.

(a) A minimum score of 95 in aptitude area ST in Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) tests administered prior to 2 January 2002.

(b) A minimum score of 91 in aptitude area ST on ASVAB tests administered on and after 2 January 2002 and prior to 1 October 2013.

(c) A minimum score of 100 in aptitude area ST on ASVAB tests administered on and after 1 October 2013.

(d) A minimum OPAT score of Standing Long Jump (LJ) – 0120 cm, Seated Power Throw (PT) – 0350 cm, Strength Deadlift (SD) – 0120 lbs., and Interval Aerobic Run (IR) – 0036 Shuttles in Physical Demand Category "Moderate" (Gold).

(5) Active component personnel (all grades): For initial award of MOS, Soldiers must attend resident training at the U.S. Army Chemical, Biological, Radiological and Nuclear School (USACBRNS) where they will be exposed, while wearing CBRN protective wear, to toxic agents in the chemical defense training facility. No other course will be the basis for MOS qualification. ARNG/USAR personnel (all grades): National Guard and Army Reserve Soldiers will attend the resident course at USACLMS or at a TASS Battalion.

(6) Per AR 600-8-19, promotion to MSG and SGM requires an interim secret eligibility or higher.

c. *Additional skill identifiers.* (Note: Refer to table 12-8 (Listing of universal ASI's associated with all enlisted MOS)).

(1) L3—Technical Escorting (skill level 1-5).

(2) L4--Biological Integrated Detection System (BIDS) (skill level 1-4, USAR only).

(4) L6--Nuclear/Biological/Chemical (NBC) Reconnaissance (skill level 1-4).

To qualify for initial entry in the AGR Program applicants must meet the eligibility requirements in AR 135-18 paragraphs 2-1, 2-2, and 2-3. IAW AR 600-8-2, Flagged ARNG and US Army Reserve (USAR) soldier may not apply for AD or ADT.

In order to comply with United States Department of Defense (DoD) requirements and ensure the safety and security of the missions, programs, property and personnel of the Nebraska Military Department and Nebraska National Guard, employees must obtain the appropriate background investigation and maintain the level of security clearance assigned to their respective work.

Failure to obtain and maintain the designated type of security clearance/background check required for the respective work, may result in a job offer being rescinded, separation of employment, and/or other actions as may be deemed in the best interest of the agency.

Prior to appointment individuals must meet the security clearance requirements for the position or submit the required documents to the Nebraska National Guard Personnel Security Manager for processing the appropriate investigation. Required forms for AGR positions – SF 86, PSIP Initiation Form, Birth Certificate (or other proof of citizenship) and Fingerprints. Technician positions also require the OF 306 and Application/Resume.

The use of official mail to forward employment applications is prohibited. Applications submitted using government postage will not be considered.

Applications may be submitted by e-mail, postal mail, or hand-delivered to the HRO no later than 1600 hours on the closing date. Applications received after the closing time will not be considered for the position.
